

Southeast Missouri Hospital College of Nursing and Health Sciences offers a two-year LPN to BSN program. After the first year the students receive an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing degree. Upon completion of the AAS graduates have met the educational requirements necessary to be eligible to take the national examination for registered nurse licensure exam. (Nurse Practice Act, Section 335.066RSMo). After the second year students receive a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree.

A registered nurse performs many duties as a member of the healthcare team. These duties include:

- Assessing a patient's condition
- Identifying patient problems or needs
- Working with the patient, family, physician, and other healthcare team members in planning patient care
- Providing treatments for patients as well as teaching patients and families to provide care
- Evaluating treatment plans to determine if additional treatment is needed

# LPN to BSN

## Associate of Applied Science in Nursing Bachelor of Science in Nursing

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

The following requirements must be met to be admitted to this program:

- National League for Nursing Nursing Acceleration Challenge Exam I (NACE I) with a score of 75% or higher
- Copy of LPN license (A current license must be maintained throughout the program. Students currently enrolled in LPN programs have 90 days after graduation to provide a copy of the license. License must be on file before beginning any nursing courses.)
- Completion of all immunization requirements
- Clearance on various background checks
- Official high school transcript showing graduation or completion of an approved high school equivalency exam
- Official transcripts from all colleges, universities, and vocational schools attended

#### **Enrollment Requirements**

The following requirements must be met after a student receives an acceptance letter but before the student can be enrolled in classes:

- Pay a \$200 seat retainer (non-refundable deposit) which will be applied to your first semester tuition and fees
- Meet with the Dean of General Education
- If currently enrolled in high school or another college or university, send transcripts when final grades are available
- Contact Southeast Occupational Medicine thirty to sixty days prior to enrolling for classes at the college to schedule and complete a urine drug screen and TB skin test. You will not be able to enroll for classes until your health screening has been completed.

#### **Second Year Requirements**

Students must complete the AAS portion of the program with a GPA of 2.80 or higher (May be tentatively admitted with a 2.50 GPA.) and pass the NCLEX-RN within 90 days after graduation in order to continue to the second year.
