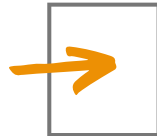


The accelerated paramedic to Registered Nurse (RN) bridge track of the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing is a one year, full-time program designed to build upon the previous experience and coursework of the student. The program prepares students for the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN) and incorporates valuable hands-on opportunities throughout clinical and classroom settings along with individualized instruction from faculty.



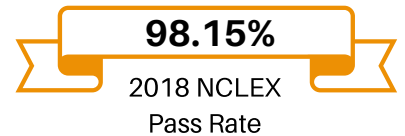

Admission Requirements

Direct Admission (students with less than 25 hours of college credit):

- cumulative high school GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale (if applicable)
- ACT composite score of 21 or SAT score of 1060 (if age 22 or younger)
- minimum one year of Paramedic work experience
- current Paramedic license

OR

Transfer Admission (students with 25 or more completed hours of college credit):

- cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- minimum one year of paramedic work experience
- current paramedic license

Admission Process

The admission process will not begin until all application materials are received. Materials are not reviewed before this time. Applications are accepted on a continuous basis and seats are offered first come, first serve to students who meet the admission requirements. There are no application deadlines; however, we encourage students to have all materials submitted at least one month prior to the start of classes.

Cost and Financial Aid

As a part of the admission and enrollment process, students will incur the following costs upfront:

- \$50 application fee
- \$100 seat retainer (deposit)
- \$93 CastleBranch fee

Accreditation

Accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) with conditional approval of the Missouri State Board of Nursing.

Required general education courses are built into the program curriculum but can be taken separately. Program courses must be taken in the order listed. Students can begin taking general education courses the semester after they are admitted.

All courses require a C or better to be considered passing.
