

Southeast Missouri Hospital College of Nursing and Health Sciences offers three semester credit hours of courses in phlebotomy. Students who complete these courses will possess entry-level skills in phlebotomy and will be prepared for entry-level positions in clinical laboratory settings such as medical centers and outpatient laboratory facilities.

**Please note that these courses may not include clinical training, which is a requirement for certification. In addition, Southeast Missouri Hospital College of Nursing and Health Sciences does not guarantee job placement for individuals completing these courses. The College encourages students to arrange clinical training prior to applying or to speak with potential employers about their job opportunities upon course completion.

Eligibility Requirements

 - ◇ Completion of an approved high school equivalency exam
 - ◇ Current high school senior at least age 18 and with approval of high school counselor

Curriculum

CLA 100 Introduction to Laboratory Science

Introduction to the field of laboratory science covering the following areas: workplace safety, medical terminology, quality control, laboratory testing and departments, and ethical and legal responsibilities. 1.0 credit

CLA 101 Phlebotomy Skills

The course includes principles of blood collection and handling, blood collection techniques and equipment, laboratory safety, infection control, professionalism, and patients' rights. 2.0 credits

Clinical Course

A limited number of seats may be available for CLA 111 to students who successfully complete the above lecture courses. Additional requirements, including a drug screen and specific immunization records, must be submitted before enrolling in this course.

CLA 111 Phlebotomy Practicum

This course is designed to qualify students to perform phlebotomy on patients to obtain suitable specimens for laboratory testing. Students will gain practical experience in phlebotomy and develop phlebotomy skills and proficiency. 2.0 credits

Schedule

CLA 100 and CLA 101 are offered during the first 8 weeks of the Spring 2020 semester, January 6 through February 28, 2020. Classes will meet Mondays and Thursdays from 3 p.m. to 5:50 p.m. CLA 111 may be offered the second 8 weeks of the Spring 2020 semester with times TBD.
